Life Group Leader Guide: Hebrews 3:12-19 Jesus Is Enough To Be Trusted

Quick Summary of the Sermon:

The sermon, titled "Jesus Is Better," is based on Hebrews 3 and emphasizes the superiority of Jesus over Moses and the importance of maintaining faith in God's goodness. The sermon highlights the human tendency to doubt God, even after experiencing His faithfulness, and links this doubt to a hardened heart caused by unbelief. The Israelites' failure to enter the Promised Land due to their unbelief serves as a warning to the first-century Hebrew Christians and to us today.
